Academic Philosophy

At Breakaway Academy, our curriculum follows the standards set forth by the Minnesota Department of Education K-12. Lessons and individual support are structured so that every student has the opportunity to exceed state standards and achieve academic excellence. Our students are held to high standards for classroom behavior and academic performance. We expect our students and teachers to push themselves to exceed state standards by not just being satisfied with meeting an objective.

Class Placement

A student's placement in the classroom is determined by teachers (current and upcoming grade level), principal, dean of students, and the director of education. Many factors are considered when placing a student, including but not limited to academic ability, social skills, teacher/student personalities, and classroom dynamics as a whole.

Class Sizes

At Breakaway Academy, we're dedicated to keeping class sizes small so teachers can devote more time and attention to each student. The maximum number of students in a classroom in grades K-3 is 12 students. In grades 4-8, the maximum number of students is 15.

Conferences

Parents have the opportunity to schedule a conference with their child's teachers and coaches during fall and spring conferences. Additional meetings are on an as-needed basis and may be scheduled at any time.

Differentiated Support

Grades K-3

Each student in grades K-3 follows an individualized learning plan. Additionally, students have one-on-one time with our reading specialist. We also provide individual and small groups for advanced learners and those who need extra help in any subject areas.

Grades 4-8

In grades 4-8, students receive instruction in math, language arts, science, social studies, and character and academic skills. Lessons are delivered to the class as a whole, in small groups, through cooperative learning, partner work, and individualized instruction from the teacher to student as needed. We offer differentiated level math classes, and we differentiate student reading levels based on NWEA MAP scores, teacher observations, parent input, and classroom performance.

The W.O.W. (Work On Weaknesses) Room is a space where teachers assign students to go during their performance, hockey, and/or soccer training time to focus on receiving additional academic support. This may be a time where students work independently on make-up work, retake an assessment, or when a student is retaught concepts by their teacher.

Students who demonstrate a need for academic support may qualify for a Breakaway Academy accommodation plan. These plans are written when a student consistently struggles to meet our standards in the classroom. See our director of education for more information.

Measures of Academic Progress

In grades K-3, we administer growth assessment through Edmentum Exact Path in the fall, winter, and spring in reading, language arts, and math. These assessments also serve to create individualized learning paths based on each student's strengths and needs.

In grades 4-8, we administer NWEA MAP testing in the fall and spring to measure each student's progress and growth over time in reading, language arts, and math.

Code of Conduct

Breakaway Academy expects students to conduct themselves in keeping with their levels of development, maturity, and demonstrated capabilities, with a proper regard for the rights and welfare of other students and school staff, the educational purpose underlying all school activities and the care of school facilities and equipment, consistent with the code of student conduct:

- I will treat everyone with respect.
- I will treat personal, school property, and the school buildings with respect.
- I will create and maintain a positive and safe school environment.
- I will come to school on time and be prepared for learning.
- I will act responsibly and accept the consequences for my actions.

Zero Tolerance Policy

Breakaway Academy has a Zero Tolerance Policy towards bullying, harassment, and intolerance, which means there is no tolerance for transgressions that interfere with the safe learning environment of others in any manner. The school feels all children have the right to attend school in a positive and constructive learning environment. If a student interferes with another's right to learn in a safe, positive environment, that student will receive consequences commensurate with the transgression and may be considered for expulsion. Offenses may result in immediate suspension and a student may be expelled from school as a result of these behaviors. Expulsion is at the discretion of the school administration.

- Bullying is defined as repeated or intentional infliction of injury or discomfort on another person through physical contact, words, or in other ways that cause harm. These include but are not limited to: saying hurtful things, making fun of others, overlooking others, hitting, kicking, telling lies, spreading false rumors, sending mean notes or text messages, and deliberately excluding someone from a group.
- Harassment is defined as behavior that is unwelcome, is directed at, or is offensive to someone, consists of objectionable conduct, comment, material or display that demeans, belittles, intimidates, or humiliates another person. Further, the person committing the act knows, or ought reasonably to know, that his or her behavior is unwelcome. Harassment may include the misuse of authority, intimidation, threats, coercion, and blackmail; it may be either personal or sexual in nature.
- Intolerance is defined as repeated or harmful displays (oral, written, or demonstrative) which are not directed at any specific individual or any specific group of specific individuals, and which are directed toward race, sexual orientation, gender, religion, or physical disabilities, and which has an effect that could demean, belittle, intimidate, or humiliate another person.

Discipline

Discipline is a way of teaching and is a necessary and positive part of our school. Teachers and coaches set clear, easy to understand expectations. Students are reinforced positively when they follow an expectation.

When a negative behavior occurs, the positive expectation is stated first. If the misbehavior continues, the staff member will write a detailed description of the situation that occurred and the student will be given either a Minor or Major Penalty, depending on the severity of the offense as outlined below. Most of these offense can be handled effectively by the teacher, coach, or principal through normal discipline. In addition, at the end of the school day, the staff member may contact the parent to provide a detailed description of what has occurred.

Minor Penalty

These typically consist of repeated non-compliant behavior and disrespect for the Breakaway Academy Code of Conduct. These include but are not limited to repeated minor disruptive behavior in class such as talking, out of seat, disturbing others, or making loud noises in close proximity to classes in session, tardiness, poor attitude, on-ice minor penalties, altercation with peers, disrespecting athletic equipment, or use of cell phones in class, during athletics or transition periods, including shuttle buses, turf, gym, locker rooms, rinks, and on-ice areas.

A student who receives three minor penalties is not permitted to play in the weekly BA Cup game/Game Day.

Major Penalty

Greater offenses include but are not limited to blatant disrespect for a teacher, coach, adult, or other students, any hands-on incidents, fighting, bullying, harassment, lying, stealing, inappropriate language or gestures, cheating on class work, plagiarism, destruction of school property, graffiti, deliberate destruction of another persons' property, and improper use of the internet.

A student who receives one major penalty is not permitted to play in the weekly BA Cup game/Game Day.

Severe Offenses

Further offenses can be addressed at the administrative level for possible suspension or expulsion. Examples of severe offenses include but are not limited to possession of drugs, tobacco, alcohol, and illegal activities. Weapons on the school premises or situations that present a threat to person(s) at school will result in immediate removal from school grounds pending an investigation to gather information regarding the situation. If necessary, appropriate authorities will be notified and appropriate measures will be taken to ensure the safety of those involved. Pending results of the investigation, a student may be expelled from school. Expulsion will be immediate and at the discretion of the school administration.



K-3rd Grade School Hours

School is in session for grades K-3 from 8:30 am to 3:00 pm at Breakaway Academy, located in the Chaska Community Center (CCC). Drop-off and pick-up are at the CCC Arena Entrance. Drop-off begins 30 minutes prior and pick-up remains 15 minutes after.

Before and After School Care

Before and after school care is available. Contact the K-3rd grade principal for more information.

Daily Schedule

In general, the youngest students begin with on-ice training to allow parents to assist with equipment, and older students begin with off-ice gym class. This may change depending on daily activities at the CCC, pool use, or double-gym days. Athletic instructors are on hand to help all students with skates and helmets.

Lunch

Students may bring healthy lunch from home or participate in the catered lunch program. Lunch is prepared and delivered by outside vendors each day.

- Each meal includes entree, fruit, vegetable, and carton of milk.
- The K-3rd grade cost is \$7+tax/service fee per lunch. The 4th-8th grade cost is \$8+tax/service fee.
- Lunches are pre-selected monthly via a Google Form. Meal selections are made in advance to help the caterers prepare an appropriate amount of food. New students must bring home lunch until the next ordering period and month availability.
- In grades 4-8, students choose from a hot entrée, cold meat and cheese sandwich, or peanut butter and jelly sandwich. Students may take extra lunch servings based on availability for an additional cost. For an additional \$3.50 plus tax, students may receive a second portion of the entree. A second side is \$2.00 plus tax. A second cart of milk is \$1.00.
- Lunch money does not need to be preloaded to your account. Lunch fees are processed through TADS, our online payment system, at the end of each month and billed on the 20th of the following month.

A La Carte Options

In 4th-8th grade, snacks and drinks are available for purchase a la carte.

- Rhody's Craft House & Grill, the restaurant located in Champions Hall, sells snack items to the public during their their operational hours. Students have access to make purchases before or after school and during their designated lunch period.
- We recommend setting parameters with your child about the a la carte items you allow them to purchase.
- Students are not permitted to buy items for other students.
- A strong emphasis on choosing healthy snacks is taught and reinforced frequently throughout the school year.

Outside Food

No outside food may be brought in the school, other than healthy home lunch and snacks.

Water Bottles

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle (labeled with his or her name). The drinking fountains and water bottle refill stations are open throughout both school buildings so students can refill.

Healthy Snacks

Eating with intention is something to be mindful of as part of developing an athlete and person of character. The best options for snacks are found outside the aisles of prepackaged foods at the grocery store. These are colorful items and may need some prep at home prior to bringing them to school. Consider including your child in food prep to help reinforce the lifestyle choices that it takes to foster an elite body and mind. Fresh fruit and vegetables with dips that provide protein are an ideal snack choice for athletes.

Prohibited Food and Drinks

During the school year, students learn about nutrition and how it plays a key part to living a healthy lifestyle. The goal of a snack or lunch is to provide energy in the middle of the day or before and after exercise. Food is fuel and it should have a purpose.

To reinforce this, only healthy snacks are allowed at Breakaway Academy. If a snack is deemed unhealthy, the student will be asked to put it away. The following are not permitted:

Food Allergies

When packing home lunch or snacks, please remember to be mindful of any students with peanut, tree nut, or other food allergies.

Health Information

To help us better understand your child's health needs, a parent or legal guardian must complete required health information upon enrollment. Required information includes health conditions, medications, healthcare procedures, allergies, concussions, and anaphylaxis treatment, if applicable.

Immunization Records

Immunization records are required for students entering Kindergarten or 7th grade, and all new students. If a child's parent or guardian, wishes to be exempt, based on their beliefs, from one or more immunization requirements, the parent or child may submit a statement to this effect, signed by the submitting person and notarized.

Immunization Records - Optional App

Docket Health, Inc. teamed-up with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to provide an app that enables easy access to your child's immunization records. Only you can authorize access of personal health data to your trusted care providers. All of your data is fully encrypted, both on Docket® servers and on your phone.

Emergency Medical Services

The welfare of your child is our first consideration. Unless your child has an Emergency Care Plan in place or you indicate otherwise, the following procedures will be followed in case of serious medical emergency:

1. 911 will be called immediately. You will be informed as soon as possible.
2. A copy of the Health Information Form will be sent with your child and the emergency attendant.
3. The school will call your documented emergency contact if you cannot be reached.
4. If you or your emergency contact cannot be reached, the school will make arrangements for emergency care as necessary.

Medication

Prescription and over-the-counter medications cannot be dispensed without written parent permission. A physician must complete authorization using the Prescription Medication Administration Form. A parent or guardian must complete authorization using the Self-Administerer OTC Consent Form.

 - Required for all new or returning students who take prescription medications during school hours.
 - Note, physician and parent/guardian signatures are required.
- Self-Administer OTC Consent Form
 - Available from the [health specialist](#) upon request.

Breakaway Academy will only dispense prescribed medication that is in the original labeled container and displays the child's full name, attending physician, medication name, dose, and instructions for use. Over-the-counter medication must be received in the original sealed container or it cannot be dispensed.

Students in Kindergarten-5th grade may not keep their own medication on their person, regardless of type (i.e. Tylenol, Advil, cough drops, etc.) All medications must be kept in the office and be dispensed by the appointed health personnel.

Students in 6th-8th grade may have over-the-counter medications for self-administration approved by their parents and with the knowledge of Breakaway Academy health appointed staff. We must have a completed Self-Administer OTC Form with a parent or guardian's signature.

Special Consent to Carry and Self-Administer Medication

Permission may be granted for a student to carry and self-administer life-saving medication only after the following process has been completed and is on file in the office. These medications may include but are not limited to inhalers, diabetic supplies/insulin and EpiPens.

1. A physician's written statement regarding the student's medical condition, medications, and dosage has been received and is understood by appointed Breakaway Academy health personnel.
2. The parent(s)/guardian(s), student(s), director, and appointed health personnel are aware of the student(s) needs, and are comfortable with the cognitive ability and maturity of the student(s) to appropriately carry and self-administer life- saving medication only.
3. The student(s) and teacher(s) is/are made aware of the student(s) special needs and the student(s) may be in possession of life saving medication.

This policy is for life saving emergency medication only.

Asthma Action Plan

If your child has asthma and carries an inhaler, please send his or her Asthma Action Plan to the designated school personnel at the appropriate Breakaway Academy location. If your child does not have an Asthma Action Plan, please call your primary clinic to request one. If your child 'self carries' an inhaler, the pharmacy label must clearly state your child's name, medication name, dose to be inhaled, and directions attached to the inhaler.

Anaphylaxis Action Plan

If your child has a known life-threatening allergy and has a prescribed EpiPen, one, preferably two EpiPens, must be provided for your child. They must be labeled with a pharmacy label, be accompanied by a completed Prescription Medication Administration Form or a copy of the physician's Anaphylaxis Action Plan with signature of the provider and parent or guardian. If your child will 'self carry' an EpiPen, the designated school personnel must be informed. Any child with a prescribed EpiPen will have them available on all school-based field trips.

Anaphylaxis Treatment Notification

Anaphylaxis is a rapid, life threatening allergic response triggered by insect stings, foods, medications, latex, exercise, or in rare cases by unknown causes. It requires immediate treatment. It is well documented that it is safer to administer epinephrine than to delay treatment for anaphylaxis. The epinephrine auto-injector rapidly delivers a premeasured, single dose of epinephrine by direct injection through the skin. If your child has a life threatening allergic reaction at school requiring epinephrine; administration, emergency medical services, parents, and the appropriate Breakaway Academy personnel will be called immediately.

Minnesota Statute 121A.2207 permits school districts to possess epinephrine auto-injectors (EpiPens) for a student or other individual experiencing anaphylaxis regardless of whether the student or individual has a prescription for an EpiPen. Therefore, Breakaway Academy has adopted a policy allowing appointed health personnel to administer an EpiPen for a severe, life-threatening allergic reaction.

The emergency EpiPen will be kept in a secure location in each of the buildings and accessible during school hours. It will not be sent on school-based field trips or available before or after the instructional school day. This protocol IS NOT intended to replace students who have known allergies and an EpiPen. This is intended for unknown, life-threatening allergic reactions.

If you do not want your child to receive a life-saving injection of epinephrine if he or she is experiencing a life-threatening allergic reaction, please send a notice to the [health specialist](#). Otherwise, parental consent is implied for all students attending Breakaway Academy. If your child has a heart condition, please talk with his or her provider about the safety of administering an EpiPen in the event of a life-threatening anaphylaxis emergency.

Illness

To preserve the health of all students and staff members, do not send a sick child to school. If your child is absent due to illness, please notify us by 8:30 am using the method defined in the Attendance section. Leave your child's name, date, and reason for absence. This will enable us to inform necessary staff of your child's absence.

Any child who has a fever (100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher) should not be sent to school under any circumstance. A child who is listless or shows active signs of illness should also be kept at home. If your child has any of the following symptoms, please keep them at home until investigated further by a medical professional:

- Persistent stomach ache
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Deep or hacking cough, even if a fever is not present
- Continuous runny nose
- Yellowish or greenish mucus
- Undiagnosed rash
- Pink, swollen, matted, and/or runny eyes that have not been treated by a physician
- Fever of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher

A child may return to school after an illness under these conditions:

- Fever and/or vomiting is gone and temperature has been normal for at least 24 consecutive hours without medication
- Energy level has returned to normal for at least 24 consecutive hours
- No symptoms or signs of diarrhea for at least 24 consecutive hours without medication
- Active signs of illness are no longer present

Chromebooks/Laptops

All K-3rd grade students are provided a school-issued Chromebook for a one-time fee of \$265 per student. Families with students in grades 4th-8th grade have the choice to select the technology package that includes a Chromebook for a fee of \$265, or provide their own laptop.

There is a \$210 technology fee per student per year; including license and support for Educate, TADS, Edmentum, and standardized testing, among others.

Students returning to Breakaway Academy keep their school-issued Chromebooks over the summer for use next year. Non-returning students and 8th grade graduates also keep their school-issued Chromebooks.

Student Email Accounts

Each student enrolled at Breakaway Academy is assigned an @breakawayacademy.net account through Google. This account allows reliable communication between the student and Breakaway Academy.

For non-returning students and 8th grade graduates, accounts are released from our management license and receive a factory reset by July 1st. For future use, students may sign in with any Google account or easily create a new account following the on-screen prompts.

Why Do We Wear Uniforms?

The purpose of Breakaway Academy uniforms is to promote respect and pride for the Breakaway Academy community and foster unity, a feeling of belonging to something bigger than oneself.

Our uniform guidelines support a student's individuality while maintaining standards. We believe wearing the proper uniform prepares students for dress in a professional environment. The uniform should promote a neat, clean, and modest appearance in all aspects.

At Breakaway Academy, we teach and reinforce the importance of wearing our school uniform with pride and to show respect for our school community:

- Students wear the appropriate uniforms with pride in class, on the turf/in the gym, and on the ice to show respect for our school and dress code.
- Students refrain from wearing hats in school, on the turf/in the gym, at the rink, or on the bus as a sign of respect.
- To show respect for our school community and dress code, students do not wear association, team, or tournament hoodies, shirts, and hats, as well as other non-Breakaway Academy items while at school, turf, gym, or the rink.

Reminders

- Breakaway Academy backpacks and hockey bags must be used.
- Hats are not permitted during school hours. Stocking caps are acceptable before or after school and on rink shuttles.
- Gym/performance/athletics/soccer apparel, including UNRL performance shirts and gray joggers, may not be worn in class.
- Polo shirts may not be worn in gym/performance/athletics/soccer training.
- Only khaki shorts and skirts are acceptable academic uniforms during seasonable weather.

New Students

We offer a new student uniform startup package to ensure each new student is set up for success when they begin their academic and athletic journey at Breakaway Academy.

New students who haven't received the required uniform prior to the start of school may wear a collared shirt with khaki pants, shorts, or skirt for academics and performance shirt and shorts for gym/performance/athletics/soccer training.

Attendance Expectations

Regular attendance is a key to academic and athletic success and is the responsibility of both the parents and students. Every attempt should be made to schedule appointments and vacations around the school schedule to minimize the impact on a student's academic and athletic experience. In the event that attendances becomes an issue interfering with a student's ability to progress, a meeting will be scheduled between parents or guardians and school administration.

Absences

If your child is not going to be at school for any reason, it is necessary to notify the school by 8:30 am. Each absence will count toward the cumulative total number of absences for the academic school year.

Reporting an Absence, Early Release or Late Arrival

The child's name, grade, and nature of the absence, late arrival, or early release must be included.

- To report a K-3rd grade attendance change, email your child's teacher and the principal. Refer to the Contact Information section for teacher email addresses.
- To report a 4th-8th grade attendance change, email attendance@breakawayacademy.net.
 - Note: Effective September 5, 2023, absence, early release or late arrival functions are not enabled in our SchoolPass app.

Late Arrival

Students who arrive at school late must use the Breakaway Academy main entrance and are required to stop by the front desk and sign in. The number of times a student is tardy each quarter appears on their report card.

Early Release

All students departing early must use the Breakaway Academy main entrance, be checked out by a Breakaway Academy staff member, and a parent or guardian must come inside the school to complete the signout process. Only at that time will your child be called from the classroom or athletics.

4th-8th Grade

- For early pickup of 4th-8th grade students at the rink, you have the choice to come inside or wait in the pickup line for your child.
- The SchoolPass dismissal alert is not enabled for early release. For early dismissals, a parent or guardian must come inside to sign the child out.

Athletic Options for K-3rd Grade:

K-3rd grade students have two athletic hours every day. The options are:

- (1) One hour of hockey and one hour of gym
- (2) Two hours of gym that provide additional sports exposure and directed play.

Note: Daily athletic selections must be made by 8:30 am.

Athletic Options for 4th-8th Grade:

To minimize burnout and nurture well-being, students may occasionally opt out of hockey or soccer on any given day and replace it with Athletic Training, structured sport-themed activities related to physical and mental improvement.

During Athletic Training, students have nearly two hours of instructor-led activities that focus on mobility, sports mindset, including nutrition, mental toughness, and exposure to various sports games. This is an option for injured student-athletes, those needing less physical activity, or recovery.

Notes:

- Athletic Training selection in SchoolPass is for use only when your child is present at school and will opt out of hockey or soccer. If your child will arrive late or leave early, resulting in a hockey or soccer absence, send an email notification to attendance@breakawayacademy.net.
- Athletic Training selection must be made by 8:30 am.
- The Athletic Training selection in SchoolPass should not be used to notify us of an early release. If your child is leaving early, please email attendance@breakawayacademy.net.
- When opting out of hockey or soccer, students must participate in Athletic Training when present at school.

Soccer Options for 5th-8th Grade:

We offer a modified athletic schedule for hockey players interested in adding soccer to their training program, and provide a choice to opt-in when it works best for your child. No long-term commitment.

Parents or guardians may sign their child up for occasional soccer training by completing a weekly sign-up form. For more info, contact the [director of soccer operations](#).

Note, students must play competitive soccer to participate in soccer training at Breakaway Academy.



PROCEDURES - DROP OFF AND PICK UP INSTRUCTIONS

Drop Off and Pick Up Instructions for K-3rd Grade

Use the Arena entrance at the Chaska Community Center to drop-off and pick up your child.

Drop Off and Pick Up Instructions for 4th-8th Grade

The entrance to Breakaway Academy is located at the west end of the Champions Hall building. For the safety of our students, it is not a public entrance to Champions Hall.

For parents or guardians who drop off or pick up at the Breakaway Academy main entrance, please follow the instructions for drop off and pick up below. Drop off and pick up locations vary by grade:

Tips for Drop Off and Pick Up Lanes

- Lane 1 is reserved for buses only. Please do not block.
- Lanes 2, 4, and 5 are designated for drop off and pick up.
- Lanes 3 and 6 are used for exiting when your lane is not moving.
- As a courtesy to others, there is absolutely no waiting in Lanes 3 and 6.
- The entrances to Lanes 3 and 6 are blocked with cones. The cones should serve as a reminder that there is no waiting in these lanes.
- Always proceed with caution watching for students crossing and/or other moving vehicles.

Dismissal Process

During your child's regular dismissal time, a parent or guardian does not need to enter the building for pickup. Upon arrival at school, enter the appropriate pick up lane. Remain in your vehicle and use the SchoolPass app to indicate you are onsite by tapping the Carline button. A notification is sent to us and your child will be released when class, performance training, or soccer training is finished. To prevent texting while driving, the app will only allow you to mark yourself as arrived in the carline once you are in the parking lot. Refer to the Appendix for step-by-step SchoolPass instructions

Carpools

If your child is leaving with another Breakaway Academy family, action must be taken in the SchoolPass app to move your child to another carpool. Refer to the Appendix for step-by-step SchoolPass instructions

Early Dismissal

The SchoolPass dismissal alert is not enabled for early release. For early dismissals, a parent or guardian must come inside to sign the child out.

8th Grade Dismissal at Rinks (Hockey Student-Athletes Only)

The SchoolPass dismissal alert is only available for dismissal from school or Champions Hall. If picking up at the rink, please text or call your child to notify them you have arrived.

Emergency Response Plan

Regardless of the type of situation that occurs, your child's safety is our first priority. Depending on the specifics of the situation, all persons onsite will either be evacuated to a safe location or kept onsite while securing the facility. In the event of either occurrence, parents or guardians will be notified by text or email so as to be completely informed of their child's status in the event of an emergency.

Inclement Weather

We take decisions regarding school operations during adverse weather conditions seriously. At Breakaway Academy, we choose to closely observe the unfolding weather conditions before reaching a conclusion rather than solely relying on weather forecasts. Our intention is to strike a balance between ensuring the safety of all and minimizing disruptions to the learning process.

In poor driving conditions, the most common modification we make to the school day is with our bus service, offering a late start or early departure of our bus riders. The decision to operate our buses will depend on the specific road and weather conditions at the time.

The safety of our students and families is our priority. We want you all safe on the roads. Ultimately, the decision to send your child to school or early release remains with you. We understand that individual circumstances may vary, and we respect your judgment in determining what's best for your child's safety.

Lost and Found

Many student items become misplaced while at school. Breakaway Academy cannot assume responsibility for such losses. We have a designated area for Lost and Found items. Any items left at the end of each quarter will be donated to a local charity. To help prevent loss of personal items, label clothing, water bottles, and lunch bags with your child's name.

Mobile Devices

Student cell phones, smartwatches, iPods, iPads, or other mobile devices are not to be used during school hours. Should students choose to bring them, they are checked in at the start of each day and checked out at the end. If students need to use a phone to contact their parent/guardian, they must receive permission from a teacher, coach, or staff member to use their phone while at the front desk.

Prohibited Items

The following items are prohibited on school grounds at any time. Possession of these items on school property will result in immediate disciplinary measures:

- tobacco in any form
- alcohol
- illegal or illicit drugs
- weapons of any kind (both real and play items)
- explosives
- fireworks
- smoke or stink bombs
- any illegal or dangerous items

Records

It is important that all student records be kept current and up to date. Any changes to student or parent/guardian information, including email, home address, contact phone numbers, emergency contact information, and special instructions should be communicated to operations@breakawayacademy.net.

Re-enrollment

Annual enrollment at Breakaway Academy occurs each January. Parents or guardians receive an email from TADS with a unique link to begin the registration process. The online form must be completed by January 31st to secure your child's place for the forthcoming year. Notice must be provided if you choose not to re-enroll. Refer to the Withdrawal from School section below for more information.

Transcripts Requests

If your child is transferring to another school, a request for transfer of records must be submitted, and all necessary information will be sent directly to the inquiring school. Submit K-3 transcript requests to the [principal](#). Submit grades 4-8 transcript requests to the [dean of students](#).

Tuition Fees and Payments

Breakaway Academy is a private school and we fund our program by collecting tuition. Each family is required to authorize a tuition billing agreement and make payments accordingly. Non-payment will result in the student not being able to attend classes and athletic training until payment is up to date.

Tuition payments are due according to the tuition contract. Late payments are assessed a finance charge per month, which is then considered part of the tuition payment. See the TADS Enrollment and Payment Contract for any fees for late payment, NSF, and other expenses.

Valuables

School staff is not responsible for valuables students bring to school or rinks. It is recommended that students leave all valuables at home. In general, students should not bring toys or special items to school unless they are intended for a specific purpose in the classroom and have been requested by the teacher.

Visitors

All parents and visitors need to sign in and receive a Visitors pass from the front desk. This is for the safety of all students at Breakway Academy as well as for the safety of visitors in the event of an emergency. This allows us to account for all people present at that time and enables us to provide a safe school environment.

Withdrawal from School

Families that choose to withdraw or not re-enroll must provide notice of their decision to school administration. Upon receiving the withdrawal request, we work together to settle any financial obligations and provide academic records.

Bus Shuttle Service

4th-8th grade students hockey student-athletes are transported to and from on-ice training at Braemar Arena or Minnesota Made. The rink shuttle service is \$200 per student per year.

Bus Transportation

Transportation is available to and from designated locations near each school and between our Chaska and Eden Prairie locations. If interested, please contact [Colton Witte](#), director of operations & technology.

Final bus routes and times are shared with families who sign up for the bus service.

School Supplies

We provide a comprehensive school supplies package for a flat fee billed via TADS, our online payment system. The cost is \$65 per K-3rd grade student per year and \$75 for per 4th-8th grade students per year. No sign up required.

The flat fee covers nearly all essential school supplies that your child needs for their classes from the first day of school until the end of the year and all those extra general items, like tissues, paper towels, wipes, copy paper, and dry-erase markers.

Items you must supply:

- Pencil case, if desired
- Headphones compatible with the school-issued Chromebook or personal computer. (All grades) Tip: Headphones with a 3.5mm jack are compatible with Chromebooks.
- Chromebook or laptop, if not utilizing the school-issued device. (Grades 4-8)

BA Brick Cup Charity Tournament

The Monday after Thanksgiving Break is a non-school day, and we use it to celebrate the BA Brick Cup, a charity hockey tournament for Squirt /10U players. Funds raised are donated to a local charity of the students' choosing. There is no participation fee, but monetary donations are accepted.

Teams participate in pool play, culminating with the BA Brick Cup title game. Games typically run from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Registration required.

6th, 7th, and 8th grade student volunteers are needed to help with game day operations, like hype music, running bench doors, announcing, score-keeping, and more. Parent volunteers are needed to supervise.

Character Week is the is a week-long celebration in grades 4-8 with special activities honoring the character traits we embody at Breakaway Academy.

Students have a chance to dress in the spirit of the daily theme, reconnect as mentors and mentees, hear special guest speakers, participate in our Pond Hockey Tournament, and much more. Each year, Character Week takes place the week of Valentine's Day.

Field Trips

Breakaway Academy takes field trips throughout the school year. Field trips vary by grade and may include but are not limited to the Children's Theater Company, Historic Fort Snelling, Minnesota History Center, Science Museum of Minnesota, Target Field, Mill City Museum, Minnesota Wild Training Camp, Minnesota Gopher Men's and Women's hockey practice, and MSHSL boys and girls hockey and soccer state tournaments.

An authorization form is completed via TADS during the enrollment process. All students participating in field trips must wear the Breakaway Academy uniform (unless stated otherwise.) Transportation for most field trips is provided utilizing our school bus service, and a portion or all of the cost may be funded by the Breakaway Foundation.

Game Days

Each week, students look forward to hockey Game Days. They have become a tradition at our schools. Parents are welcome to attend.

- **K-3rd Grade:** Students are divided into equal teams per grade and compete each Friday in the BA Cup competition. At the end of the semester, teams are seeded and participate in a playoff to determine the BA Cup Champions.

Throughout the week, students are rewarded for great effort and behavior in the classroom and during athletics by being named team captain for a week. Students not following school rules or expectations will receive minor and major penalties, according to the severity of the offense. If a student receives three minors or one major penalty during the week, he or she will not be allowed to participate in Friday game days.

- **4th-8th Grade:** Game Days are twice each week, and vary per grade. One Game Day is dedicated to small area games and our in-house 3-on-3 League; the other Game Day, allows for 5-on-5 full-ice games. The school year wraps up with the Hegenes Cup competition, named after our cofounder, Gary Hegenes.

Holidays

Teachers in grades K-5 may choose to host class parties to celebrate Halloween, Christmas and Hanukkah, and Valentine's Day. Dates and expectations will be communicated accordingly by your child's teacher(s).

Halloween

All students are encouraged to participate in our annual Halloween Costume Contest. It's a fun tradition that draws a lot of creativity among students and staff alike. Prizes are awarded for the best dressed.

Halloween candy is not permitted. We want to uphold our standards for living healthy lifestyles. Please choose healthy snacks and beverages if you wish to share with classmates.

Students may wear festive holiday sweaters or attire on the designated day before winter break. Students are not permitted to wear rival hockey or soccer jerseys as their "ugly sweater."

Valentine's Day

Valentine's Day candy is not permitted. Please choose healthy snacks and beverages if you wish to share with classmates.

Mentor Days

During Mentor Day, students are paired up as mentor and mentee to participate in fun educational, athletic, and leadership activities emphasizing becoming a good student, an unbelievable athlete, and an outstanding person. Mentor Days take place in the fall and spring in grades 4-8.

 - If "EARLY PICKUP" appears at the top of your screen, the app will not function properly. To fix, swipe out. Then, close the app fully.
